**Article II. Offenses Against Property**

**Sec. 50-41. Malicious acts.**

No person of any age shall intentionally and/or willfully and/or maliciously do any act which shall damage or destroy any property of another or any publicly owned property in the city, or take part in any disturbance or commotion wherein acts are done by any participant therein intentionally and/or willfully and/or maliciously which shall cause damage to any property of another, or which is publicly owned in the city.

**ARTICLE VII. OFFENSES INVOLVING UNDERAGED PERSONS**  
**DIVISION 2. OFFENSES ON SCHOOL PROPERTY**

**Sec. 50-223. Curfew.**

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person between the ages of 14 years and 17 years of age to loiter, idle, congregate or remain in or upon any street, alley, park or public place in the city between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. immediately following, unless such person is accompanied by his parent, guardian or other person having legal custody, or while the performance of some lawful employment of such minor makes it necessary that the minor be upon a street, alley, park or public place during the nighttime, between such specified hours, and except as otherwise provided in this section.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 14 years to loiter, idle, congregate or remain in or upon any street, alley, park or public place in the city between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. immediately following, unless such person is accompanied by his parent, guardian or other person having legal custody of the minor.

(c) Any person of the age of 16 years or over assisting, aiding, abetting, allowing, permitting or encouraging any minor under the age of 17 years in violation of provisions of subsection (a) and (b) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor.

(d) Students attending school functions or functions sponsored or authorized by public or private schools, or community-sponsored functions, shall be at their respective homes within 60 minutes after such programs close. This shall include sporting events.

(e) A student working between the hours set forth in subsection (a) of this section shall secure a card or note from his employer if he is upon the streets or public places between the hours above set forth, and shall, between those hours, have his card in his possession and exhibit the card to any officer upon request.

(f) It shall be unlawful for any parent, guardian or other person having the legal care and custody of any minor under the age of 17 years to allow or permit any child, while in his legal custody, to violate subsections (a) and (b) of this section.

(g) Each member of the city police department, county sheriff's department, deputy sheriff, or state police, or other police agency, while on duty, is hereby authorized to arrest without warrant any person within his presence violating any of the provisions of this section and detain such person for a reasonable time until complaint can be made and warrant issued and served.

(h) Any person, either a minor under the age of 17 years, or parent or guardian or legal guardian of any such minor, violating any of the provisions of this section shall be punished as provided in section 1-14.

**Sec. 50-224. Civil liability for damages.**

Any person who shall violate section 50-41, including the parent or other person having custody of the minor child under the age of 18 years, shall be liable to the owner of any property damaged or destroyed in an amount double the actual costs of repairing or replacing the damaged property; the extra amount to cover the damage of delay, loss of use, etc.

**Sec. 50-225. Penalty for parents, guardians.**

Any parent or other person having custody of a minor child who shall be guilty of violating section 50-41 as provided for in section 50-226 shall be punished as provided in section 1-14.

**Sec. 50-226. Presumption of parents' guilt.**

The parent or any other person who has custody of any minor child under the age of 18 years, who shall fail or neglect to train or instruct their child in the property rights of others, which minor child has violated section 50-41, shall be equally guilty with the child of violating section 50-41; and in the event of violation of section 50-41 by any minor child under the age of 18 years, it shall be presumed that the parent or other person having custody of the child failed in their duty to train and instruct the child in the property rights of others.
